Introductory Letter from Dr. Richard Pollak


Dear Friend,

What Is a Clinical Trial?

A Clinical Trial is research dedicated to improving methods of treatment for patients. New medicines and devices used to treat foot or ankle pain are developed constantly, however before they can be prescribed to patients, they need to be tested in an investigational research study. Clinical trials are medical research studies set up to perform this testing on qualified patients.

What Happens During a Clinical Trial?








Do They Use the Latest in Technology and Treatment?




